With English, I pay no cost.



Hi, I am Sai Manoj, and I am studying in 8th standard. I want to share the hardest day of my life through this story, so you can learn about the dangers of junk food and how to avoid and overcome its effects.

When I was five years old, I used to eat a lot of chips like Lays, Bingo, etc.—sometimes up to five packets a day. The impact wasn't immediate, but after three years, my mother noticed that I was walking differently. She observed this for three months, and we tried various treatments, including Puthoor bandage, but nothing seemed to work. Finally, we consulted a doctor who informed us that I needed surgery. After taking blood tests, the doctor discovered my kidney had failed due to high salt levels in my blood.

I was immediately sent to Rainbow Hospital, where the doctors were shocked at how active I still was, despite my kidney failure. They quickly arranged an operation, gave me anesthesia, and inserted a tube in my neck for dialysis. Later, we went to Kanchi Kamakoti Child Trust Hospital, where they replaced the tube in my neck with one in my stomach. Throughout all this, my mother was by my side, providing me with unwavering support.

After six months, we had a choice between going to St. John's Hospital in Bangalore or continuing treatment at KMC. We decided to go to St. John's, and there I met some wonderful people who became like family. I had to stay in bed for up to eight hours at a time, but the people there gave me great companionship and helped me stay strong.

My mother decided to donate one of her kidneys to me, and the kidney transplant was successful. I was able to overcome everything, and it was all thanks to my mother. She gave me incredible physical and emotional support throughout the entire journey.

She is a wonderful gift from God in my life, and I want to take this opportunity to thank God for blessing me with such an amazing mother.
